Welcome to 2024! Here are three important January dates in American history we should be aware of:

*1/17 Desert Storm (Persian Gulf) Began (1991) - Early on 17 January 1991, Operation desert shield came to an end when the air campaign of Operation desert storm began.

Task Force Normandy, consisting of nine AH-64 Apache

helicopters from the U.S. Army's 101st Aviation Regiment, 101st ABN DVN (Air Assault), accompanied by four Air Force MH-53 Pave Low special operations helicopters, flying fast and low, opened fire at 0236 Baghdad time, on 17 January. *1/27 Vietnam War Cease Fire (1973) - Two months after the signing of the Vietnam peace agreement, the last U.S. combat troops leave South Vietnam as Hanoi frees many of the remaining American prisoners of war held in North Vietnam. America's direct eight-year intervention in the Vietnam War was at an end. In Saigon, some 7,000 U.S. Department of Defense civilian employees remained behind to aid South Vietnam in conducting what looked to be a fierce and ongoing war with communist North Vietnam.

*1/31 Panama Campaign Ended (1990) - Operation Just Cause, U.S. military action (December 1989–January 1990) that centered on the invasion of Panama for the purposes of removing Gen. Manuel Noriega, the country's dictatorial de facto ruler, from power and extraditing him to the U.S. to face charges of drug trafficking and

money laundering.

Legionnaires January 2024 Membership Update

The 2023 Membership Cards have expired. You must have a 2024 card to attend monthly Legion Meetings as well as to purchase alcohol at our Post.

National has initiated an option for members to renew **On Line** (legion.org) for up to three years at the current membership rate (\$50 per year). This only applies to **On Line** renewals (at legion.org), and only for years 2024, 2025, 2026. For members who have already renewed their 2024 membership, you will be able to participate in multiple year renewals beginning with your 2025 renewal. This is not an option for anyone who pays at the Post, whether cash or check.

Please note: Anyone applying for new membership, or that is transferring from the Michigan at large Post 0225, you must submit a copy of your DD-214. Feel free to black out or redact your Social Security number, we also will return it once your membership is approved. We cannot process or approve either without your DD-214.

Please remember to **write your membership number** on your **check**, or if renewing at the Post write it on the membership renewal and/or application (print CLEARLY), you can always just print a copy of your card and include it. This is not necessary if you use the form sent to you in the mail as your card number is already printed on it.
